

West Haddlesey Parish Meeting

Minutes of the Meeting held at the George and Dragon Public House, West Haddlesey on Tuesday 16 July 2001

1. Apologies for Absence

There were apologies from Mr and Mrs Walton and Judy Smith.

2. Minutes of the last Meeting dated 20 February 2001

The Minutes of the last Meeting dated 20 February 2001 were read and agreed as being a true record.

3. Matters Arising from Minutes

3.1. Tree Planting in the Avenue

Mike and Elizabeth Wetherell and Ian were thanked for their efforts.

3.2. Street Lights in the Avenue

All the street lights were now installed and working.

4. Planning Application for a Conservatory at The Gatehouse, Field Lane

After looking at the drawings of the proposed conservatory, no observations were made.

5. Nominee for Governor of Chapel Haddlesey School

It was agreed to let a member of Chapel Haddlesey parish continue as Governor.

6. Village Signs

It was agreed to have three signs all on the left of approaching traffic to the village. The grant had been secured to cover 90% of the cost which was to be £1480 + VAT.

Roger Denton volunteered to plant flowers in the base of the signs for the first year.

7. Speeding through the Village

After some discussion it was agreed that there should be no further signs or speed bumps. The additional street lights would allow the 30MPH signs to be erected by Tankards Bridge and this, together with wider white lines on the bridge, was thought to be the best option.

8. Playing Field Progress

The trust had now been officially set up with Christine Andrews as a trustee.

A grant of £20,000 had been offered from the Landfill Tax Credit scheme and another £20,000 grant was being considered. Both grants were subject to 10% funding from the trust.

Six foot chain link fencing was to be installed on the north and east boundaries and ranch style fencing on the south and west boundaries.

A newsletter would be issued in the near future and further fund-raising would start soon.

Insurance was estimated at £195 per annum and the total estimated annual running costs would be around £700.

9. Progress with Ongoing Planning Applications

The application for two houses on land adjacent to Laburnum Cottage was still awaiting a decision from Selby District Council. Since the severe flooding of the winter, the land concerned is subject to a PPG25 agreement.

10 Any Other Business

10.1 The Condition of the Avenue

After much discussion, it was agreed that the Clerk should set up a meeting with Duffy's and the Highways Agency to sort out the problems.

It was further agreed to get prices and go ahead with strimming and tidying the Avenue.

10.2 Condition of some Dykes

After discussion, it was agreed that the Chairman would set up a meeting with Mr Reynolds of Selby District Council Environmental Services.

10.3 Land Adjacent to the George and Dragon

After discussion there was still some uncertainty regarding the future of this land and it was agreed that the Chairman should consult with Selby District Council
